Awana Clubs Overview

Meeting Time:

Fridays from 7:20pm to 9:10pm. Check-in begins at 7:05PM

Handbook Makeup Time:

Fridays from 6:30pm to 7:00pm (By Appointment Only)

Children will make new friends, play exciting games, enjoy challenging contests, earn awards, and learn Biblical truths. Below is a list of our clubs:



Cubbies (3-4 Year Old): Cubbies celebrate the spiritual potential of preschoolers by helping them develop respect for God, His Son, and His Word.



Sparks (K-2nd Grade): Sparks ignites the curiosity of early elementary-age kids to learn about the people and events of the Bible, which in-turn helps to build a strong foundation of wisdom for knowing Christ.



Truth & Training (3rd-5th Grade): T&T engages kids by answering their questions about God and the Bible, guiding them through this pivotal life stage to grow in Christ's grace.



Club Segments

Opening Ceremony

All clubbers should be in their assigned row in the sanctuary to begin by 7:20pm. The Awana flag and the U.S. flag will be presented. Clubbers will stand at attention with their right hands over their hearts, and recite Pledge of Allegiance first and then recite Pledge to the Awana Flag. Opening Ceremony will conclude with a prayer.

Pledge of Allegiance

"I pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States of America, and to the republic for which it stands, one nation under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all."

Awana Flag Pledge

"I pledge allegiance to the Awana flag, which stands for the Awana Clubs, whose goal is to reach boys and girls with the Gospel of Christ, and train them to serve Him."

There are three different segments for each club. Each segment runs approximately 30 minutes:

- Small Group Time: Trained adult leaders, each works with a small group of clubbers listening to them recite their sections, carefully explaining the truth of God's Word and encouraging them to apply its truth. Prayer time is also done at this time.
- Large Group Time: Exemplary adult speakers deliver
 a clear presentation of the Gospel or a challenging
 lesson in applying biblical truths to everyday life with
 exciting stories and/or visual aids. Clubbers are
 challenged to accept Christ and grow spiritually.
- **Game Time**: A fun and exciting time for all clubbers. They participate in games just for their age level for fun, to develop good sportsmanship, and to encourage clubbers to work as a team.



Child Safety and Check-In/out Policy

The security and protection of your children are of great importance to the church and the Awana leadership. Parent(s), or Legal Guardian(s) must check-in and check-out clubbers at the designated areas each week. Please do not allow your child to linger unattended anywhere in the church before and after Awana.

Adult leaders will guide your child to each segment of the club night. Each Awana leader has completed a volunteer background clearance in order to be able to work with the clubbers. All leaders will be wearing a uniform and nametag to help easily identify them as Awana leaders.

Check-In Policy

Designated check-in desks are located in near the sanctuary entrance (north side). For Sparks and T&T clubs, after check-in and picking up his/her ID, your child will be directed by a leader to the sanctuary. Please ensure your child proceed directly to the sanctuary immediately after check-in before leaving the check-in area. For Cubbies club, after your child is seated, please take his/her bag and coats to his/her classroom located in the preschool area.

Parents are welcomed to attend the Opening Ceremony in the parents' section of the sanctuary each evening. Parents may not accompany the clubbers to other segments of the evening.

Check-Out Policy

Parent(s), Legal Guardian(s) or designated Responsible Person must check-out all clubbers at the designated areas. See the table below for each club's designated check-out area.

For the safety of your child, each child must be picked up by the authorized pick-up person pictured on his/her ID badge, unless a written notice specifying a *responsible person* is provided at check-in. If someone other than the designated parent/guardian on record is to pick up your child, a special instruction slip must be completed and signed by the parent/guardian on record. The designated person must present his/her photo ID before we could release your child to him/her. Acceptable ID includes valid driver license, valid passport, or other valid government issued identification documents.

Guidelines and Conduct

In order to have a safe, enjoyable, and orderly environment, our club has established the following conduct guidelines and discipline policy during club time. It is the parents' responsibility to ensure your kids follows the proper conduct guidelines at church facilities before and after club. Please read and discuss the following with your child:



Awana Code of Conduct

- 1. I will treat everyone with courtesy and respect.
- 2. I will treat personal and church property with respect.
- 3. I will create and maintain a positive and safe environment.
- 4. I will come to Awana prepared for learning.
- 5. I will act responsibly and accept consequences for my actions.
- 6. I will help everyone in Awana feel capable, connected, and contributing.

Awana Club Rules

- 1. **Be on time:** Check-in begins at 7:05pm and club starts promptly at 7:20pm
- 2. Bring handbooks and Bible
- 3. Wear uniform (MUST be in Uniform to receive awards) and tennis shoes
- 4. Walk at all times (except during Game Time).
- 5. Display Care and Respect for others and all church property.
- 6. No snacks during club time. Water bottle OK. May drink water from water fountain.
- 7. Remain with your leader at all times during club.
- 8. Do not linger/play unattended anywhere in church at any time before or after club.

Awana 5-Count is used to get all clubbers' attention. The director or leader who is in charge will begin to count aloud, slowly from one to five. When clubbers hear this count begin, they should immediately be quiet and give their full attention to the one in charge.

Awana 3-Count System

If a clubber is mean or disrespectful, then the Three-Count system is implemented.

Count 1: Clubber will receive a verbal warning from leader.

Count 2: Clubber will receive a verbal warning from director.

Count 3: Parents will be called and clubber will be sent home. The clubber may return

to club the following week under when he/she is ready to respect club rules

If clubber's misbehaving or disrespectful conduct is serious during club time, a written Parent Notice will be issued. The clubber will be suspended for future meeting upon issuance of the 3rd Parental Notice. Clubbers are welcome to return under probation to ensure corrective action is taken and their behavior becomes acceptable.

Awards and Awana Dollars

Uniform Awards

As clubbers complete each section in their handbook, they will receive awards to be proudly displayed on their uniforms. When a clubber completes a handbook, they are eligible to receive an award at the Awards Ceremony at the end of the club year.



Awana Dollars

Clubbers will be rewarded with "Awana Dollars" for wearing uniform, bringing a friend, passing sections, winning a game, and many other positive activities. "Awana Dollars" can be used to purchase various little toys, games, and candy, etc. on Awana Store Nights (see calendar). We have Awana Store before Christmas and Mother/Father's Day to encourage children to shop for items to give away as Christmas and Mother/Father's Day presents. We want our children to be "other-centered" and experience the joy of giving.



Awana Dollars can be earned as follows:

Completing a Book Section:	5 Awana Dollars (per section)
Completing an Extra Credit Subsection (T&T)	2 Awana Dollars (per subsection)
Bringing A Friend:	5 Awana Dollars (per guest)
Prepared handbook section at home (with parent's signature)	2 Awana Dollar (per section)
Winning Team at Game Time:	1 Awana Dollar per team member
Arrive on time, wearing Uniform, brining handbook and Bible:	1 Awana Dollar
Comes to Awana 4 Nights in a Row	1 Awana Dollar
Attending Church on Sunday:	1 Awana Dollar
Participating in Theme Nights:	1 Awana Dollar
Setting good examples for others:	1 Awana Dollar at leader's discretion

Year-End Book Awards

These awards (ribbons, pins, and trophies) are given at the end of the year Awards Night to clubbers who have completed their handbooks.



Uniform and Handbook Policy, Weekly Dues

Uniforms

Upon completion of the Entrance Booklet (see below), each clubber will receive an official Awana uniform. Clubbers are required to wear his/her uniforms.

NO AWARDS will be issued to clubbers who have not earned their uniform, or are not wearing their uniform on the evening they are to receive an award. The uniform is a vital component of the entire program, please encourage your clubber to wear it.

We ask that each child wear closed-toe shoes with shoe laces each week and clothing that is suitable for an active game time.

Entrance Booklet

Each new clubber is given an Entrance Booklet which includes memorization material as well as general information about their club. Clubbers are expected to complete this booklet within 1 month of joining Awana to be eligible to continue in the club.

Handbook

The Handbooks are the means by which the clubber memorizes the Scriptures and

earns uniform awards. Clubbers should complete one Handbook per year; an additional book and extra credit awards are available to those who finish their Handbook early. It is essential for you to work with and encourage your children in their scripture memory and handbook activities, both in the Entrance Booklets and Handbooks.

- For Cubbies, the clubbers learn and recites each section to a parent or completes the required activity with a parent at home. The parent's signature indicates that the work has been completed. <u>Please be sure to sign your child's book</u> <u>before next club meeting.</u>
- For Sparks and T&T, clubbers work at home with help and encouragements from a parent throughout the week in preparation for the Club meeting.



- For Sparks, we encourage each clubber to strive for complete 3-4 verses per week.
- Parents should sign BELOW the "Leader Signature" to indicate home preparation has been complete for clubbers to receive "Awana Dollars"

Uniform and Handbook Replacement Cost

If your clubber's handbook or uniform is lost, you are expected to pay the full replacement cost of each item including tax and shipping. The replacement cost for uniform can be found online at https://www.awana.org/shop/.

Weekly Dues

Weekly dues/offerings for Awana are \$1.00 per week per Clubber. The collection of dues serves several purposes:

- Pay for weekly and year-end Awards earned by clubbers
- Pay for supplies to be used by clubbers
- Help teach the clubber responsibility to give
- Learn about making offerings to the Lord

Weekly dues are collected by the club secretary at the beginning of the club during come-in and/or check-in time.

It is important for your children to put the offering into the collection jar themselves so they can learn about making offerings to the Lord.



Parent Roles

"Train up a child in the way he should go: and when he is old, he will not depart from it." Proverbs 22:6 (NKJV)



We encourage you to invest in your child's growing faith by

- Reading and discussing Handbook sections with your child
- Helping him/her to memorize the verses
- Working with him/her to complete at-home activities
- Living out the truth of the Bible in your home.

Working through the handbook with your child develops your spiritual leadership and helps you instill your child with a lifelong Biblical worldview.

All parents should ensure that their child is keeping up with the minimum handbook progress listed in the handbook schedule for each club.

Cubbies Parents

Cubbies encourages parental involvement. Your child's handbooks feature parent-child home activities and a CD with readings of all the stories and memory verses is included with the hand. We encourage you to lead your child through handbook sections, called Bear Hugs, to prepare for the next club gathering. Each Bear Hug includes optional activities, called "Under the Apple Tree," for reviewing Bible verses and lessons learned earlier.

Sparks Parents

Help your children prepare each week:

LISTEN: Each handbook includes an audio CD with readings of all the Bible biographies, memory verses and character stories featuring Sparky the Firefly and his friends Chloe, Jacob, and Joel.

SPEAK: Help your child say the verse aloud. Repeat phrase by phrase. Review every night before going to bed. Say it together while driving.

ACTIVITY: Write out the entire verse and repeat. Create puzzles together to put the verse in the proper order. Create fun games and learn together.

T&T Parents

The new T&T curriculum has been built to encourage parents to become involved in their child's spiritual development in greater ways. The handbook includes simple activities in the "Start Here" activity for parents to participate in their child's handbook experience. We also encourage you to work with your child each week to help them learn their verses so they are prepared when they come to club.

This year all T&T clubbers will work on the same handbook regardless of age and previous Awana

attendance. They will start with the Start Zone entrance booklet and work on it for 2 weeks. Then they will work on the new Mission: Agents of Grace handbook.

Important Tips for Parents

- 1. Please bring your child to club 10-15 minutes early. Awana Dollars are given for on-time check-ins.
- 2. Help your child find a place to keep their Handbook and Bible.
- 3. Make sure your child wears his/her uniform to club. If they do not have a uniform or have not earned one yet, casual clothes and tennis shoes should be worn.
- 4. Make sure your child brings their Entrance Booklet or Handbook, offering, Bible, and are prepared with the night's theme. Awana Dollars are given for each of these things, as well as church attendance and bringing a friend. Refer to Calendar for specific themes.
- 5. Help your child prepare for club each week by spending time at home with them reading and reviewing their Handbook sections and verses. If they do not have a Bible, please contact the club director. No child should be trying to complete their Handbook without a Bible.
- 6. Encourage your child by familiarizing yourself with their Handbook, especially the non-verse sections. Often these sections require more time and home related tasks and activities.
- 7. Gently remind them to spend 5-10 minutes each day on verses. Memorizing is hard work! If a child works on his/her Handbook 10 minutes each day, and completes two sections each week, they can complete their book in one year.
- 8. Please note we encourage you to work with your child in their handbook, **but parents cannot sign off** in their child's handbook.
- 9. All parents are welcome to attend any club, any night, as a visitor with their child. If you do not have a church home, we would like to invite you to visit our church.




