5. Habits of grace are Spirit empowered

Rom 8:11, If the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, he who raised Christ Jesus from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies through his Spirit who dwells in you.

1. Word

And we impart this in words not taught by human wisdom but taught <u>by the Spirit</u>, interpreting spiritual truths to those who are spiritual.

1 Cor 2:13

2. Prayer

Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness. For we do not know what to pray for as we ought, but <u>the Spirit himself intercedes</u> for us with groanings too deep for words. Romans 8:26

3. Worship

For we are the circumcision, who worship <u>by</u> <u>the Spirit of God</u> and glory in Christ Jesus and put no confidence in the flesh— Phil 3:3

7. Fellowship

Therefore if there is any consolation in Christ, if any comfort of love, if any fellowship of the Spirit, if any affection and mercy, fulfill my joy by being like-minded, having the same love, being of one accord, of one mind. Phil 2:1-2
