Even as we wisely present Jesus as our Messiah, some foolishly reject him as their Lord.

## 1. A Reasonable Presentation of What Jesus Has Accomplished for Us, 25:23-26:23

a. The clear innocence of God's servant, 25:23-27 despite the innocence of our faith, some will still try to find something wrong with us

b. The earlier disobedience of God's servant, 26:1-11

c. The present obedience of God's servant, 26:12-23 like the apostle Paul, our own conversion experience radically reframes what we cherish and pursue in life (God's heavenly vision influences our earthly passion)

## 2. An Irrational Dismissal of What We Have Testified about Jesus, 26:24-32

a. The crazy rejection of God's servant, 26:24-25 the litmus test for truth: not what seems rational to our minds or feels right in our hearts, but what God has revealed in his word

b. The passionate longing of God's servant, 26:26-29 whenever we defend our faith before others, it's not just about winning an argument about truth - it's about leading an individual to faith in Jesus (apologetics is a bridge to evangelism)

c. The confirmed innocence of God's servant, 26:30-32
