Overview

BOLCCC Summer Camp provides a dynamic, faith-filled program designed to inspire growth in the whole child academically, socially, physically, creatively, and spiritually.

Each day, campers engage in hands-on, inquiry-driven, and project-based learning experiences that include STEAM enrichment, language and literacy development, outdoor play, and engaging theme-based activities.

Children explore science concepts through interactive experiments, cooking projects, and sensory exploration that encourage curiosity and discovery.

Weekly highlights include engaging offsite field trips and onsite water play days.

Campers enrolled July 13–17 will participate in VBS in place of a field trip.

Through a balance of exploration, creativity, and meaningful chapel experiences, campers build skills, character, friendships, and a deeper understanding of God’s love in a supportive community.

2026 Summer Day Camp Field Trip Schedule

Week 1 (6/15- 6/19)

Scooter's Jungle

6/17 (Wednesday)

Children can have a blast on gigantic inflatable slides, ride sit-down scooters, and explore a two-story play structure. They can also challenge friends to a game of air hockey or ping pong.

Week 2 (6/22- 6/26)

Rancho Los Cerritos

6/24 (Wednesday)

This unique two-story adobe house once served as the headquarters for both a cattle and a sheep ranch. Today, it is recognized as a Local, State, and National Historic Landmark. As a nonprofit museum, RLC offers educational programs, engaging exhibitions, and immersive historic interpretation.

Week 3 (6/29-7/3)

Adventure City

7/1 (Wednesday)

Students will enjoy thrilling rides, including the roller coaster, the Freeway Coaster, and the Rewind Racer. They can take a scenic train ride around the park and visit the petting farm to feed the animals. The visit concludes at the cooling station.

Week 4 (7/21-7/25)

California Science Center

7/8 (Wednesday)

Students will explore human inventions, innovation, the life processes of living things, and even travel to awe-inspiring new worlds in the IMAX Theater, experiencing vibrant colors and captivating sounds.

Week 5 (7/13-7/17)

VBS /No Field Trip

VBS Week

Bread of Life Church will host its annual Vacation Bible School in the morning, followed by Summer Day Camp activities after lunch.

Week 6 (7/20-7/24)

Star Eco Station

7/22 (Wednesday)

Students will discover the latest developments in environmental protection and learn how wildlife interacts with different ecosystems. They will get up close with rescued exotic animals, including tortoises, pythons, alligators, parrots, arachnids, lizards, and even some small furry friends!

Week 7 (7/27-7/31)

Aquarium of the Pacific

7/29 (Wednesday)

Students will enjoy a self-guided tour featuring penguins, sea otters, and sea jellies. They will also explore touch tanks filled with sea stars, urchins, crabs, rays, and even sharks.

Week 8 (8/3-8/7)

Discovery Cube

8/5 (Wednesday)

Children will engage with exciting, hands-on science exhibits and activities. They can create cloud rings, climb a rock wall, play in the discovery market, explore the helicopter tour play area, and visit the sea lab and touch tanks for a fun and educational experience.

Week 9 (8/10-8/14)

Scooter's Jungle

Children can have a blast on gigantic inflatable slides, ride sit-down scooters, and explore a two-story play structure. They can also challenge friends to a game of air hockey or ping pong.

All scheduled field trips are subject to change. Occasionally, trips may be modified, rescheduled, or canceled due to factors such as weather conditions, transportation availability, or other unforeseen circumstances. Parents and guardians will be notified in advance of any changes, and alternative activities will be provided if a trip cannot take place as planned.

Admissions Criteria

Age and Development Requirement

BOLCCC accepts children from 5 to 12 years old. BOLCCC reserves the right to evaluate each child's maturity and overall readiness for participation in Summer Day Camp. If, in our professional judgment, a child is not yet developmentally prepared for the camp experience, we may decline enrollment or, if the age requirement is met, refer the child to our Preschool Program to ensure a safe, positive, and successful experience for all participants.

Space Availability

Admission is contingent upon space availability and the center's licensed capacity.

Classroom Placement

Group placement is determined by two key factors: a child's age and developmental readiness. Children must meet both age and developmental criteria for placement in a specific group.

Self-Care

Children are expected to use the toilet independently, without staff assistance. Children who require frequent restroom breaks may not be able to participate in certain field trips, as supervision and facility access cannot always be guaranteed at off-site locations.

Program Participation, Special Needs or Accommodations

Enrollment is contingent upon the child's ability to participate safely within the program's required teacher-to-child ratios. This requirement helps ensure each child's wellbeing, safety, and developmental support within the group environment.

The program must be able to meet each child's needs within supervision ratios to ensure a safe and supportive environment for all. Enrollment may be declined if a child requires additional supervision in order to keep themselves or others safe or to safely participate in the program.

Families are encouraged to share any known special needs, medical conditions, developmental or learning needs, or required accommodations needed for participation in the program.

Health & Immunization Criteria

Children who are homeschooled must provide immunization records prior to admission in accordance with the California Department of Public Health requirements. Children with contagious illnesses will not be admitted until cleared by a healthcare provider.

Enrollment Documentation

Before admission, the following documents must be completed and submitted:

- Summer Day Camp Registration Form
- Authorization and Permissions
- Field Trip Authorization Form
- Identification and Emergency Information
- Tuition & Program Policies

Trial/Probation Period

A probationary period of 1 week may be established to assess the child's adjustment and compatibility with the program. Continuation of enrollment is based on the child's ability to safely and effectively participate in the program.
